What we would like you to know

- Buses along the Finchley Road and Abbey Road corridors, to the south of Swiss Cottage have more space than is needed for customers using them
- We propose to withdraw bus route 31 and make changes to routes 113 and 189 to better match demand for buses in the area, while keeping bus links to the destinations where people wish to travel. We consider this would help simplify the bus network by reducing the number of parallel bus routes
- Access to a number of key destinations would be changed by the proposals for routes 31, 113 and 189. These include the Hospital of St. John and St. Elizabeth, Wellington Hospital, Kilburn High Road, St. Augustine's High School and Lord's Cricket Ground
- Although we propose to restructure this local network to retain key journey links, some people may need to change buses to continue making their journey if the proposals were to be implemented
- Some customers may have to wait longer at stops as a result of these proposals.
 However, the proposed changes to routes 113 and 189 would form part of a core
 network on which a high frequency (a minimum 12-minute scheduled wait time
 between buses) would be provided on all days of the week from early in the
 morning to late at night
- Routes 13 and 139 would be unchanged and provide important connections for trips currently made on the sections of routes 113 and 189 that are subject to proposed changes
- All our buses are low floor and 95 per cent of bus stops are accessible. This will help to minimise difficulty for customers alighting and changing between buses in future
- The Hopper fare provides the ability to make a second journey within 60 minutes of boarding the first bus. Most journeys that may require interchange would be able to take advantage of the Hopper fare

How these proposals may change your current journey

- Some customers who currently have direct journeys to their destination on route 31 may have to change between routes 113 and 189 to complete their journey
- Re-routeing the 113 to terminate at White City would create new journey links between Hendon Way/Finchley Road and Belsize Road/Maida Hill/White City. Customers travelling between these locations would experience quicker journey times and would no longer need to change between bus routes in future

Interchange options under this proposal:

- For westbound journeys, same-stop interchange would be available at four stops on the corridor between Swiss Cottage and Abbey Road. All four stops have a shelter with seating. Two of the four stops have a Countdown sign displaying expected bus arrival times
- For eastbound journeys, same-stop interchange would be available at stop "South Hampstead Station/Loudon Road" on Belsize Road, which has a shelter with seating. However, there is currently not a Countdown sign displaying expected bus arrival times

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Customers who use route 113 should note the following

How these proposals may change your current journey

- Customers wishing to travel to Marble Arch would need to change onto/from bus route 13 to complete their journeys
- Re-routing the 113 from Swiss Cottage to White City, rather than its current terminus at Marble Arch, would better match capacity with demand between Swiss Cottage and central London along Finchley Road and would keep the bus links currently provided by route 31 between Swiss Cottage and White City
- Re-routeing the 113 to terminate at White City would provide new direct links between Hendon Way/Finchley Road and Belsize Road/Maida Hill/White City. Customers travelling between these locations may experience quicker journey times and would no longer need to change between bus routes to complete their journey

Interchange options under this proposal:

- For northbound journeys, same-stop interchange would be available at nine stops on the Finchley Road between route 13 and 113. To assist customers waiting to board, all nine stops have a shelter with seating. One of the nine stops has a Countdown sign displaying expected bus arrival times
- For southbound journeys, same-stop interchange would be available at 11 stops between Fortune Green Road and Swiss Cottage Station from route 113 to route 13. Of these only Swiss Cottage Station/Stop D on Finchley Road does not have a shelter. One of the 11 stops has a Countdown sign displaying expected bus arrival times

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Customers who use route 189 should note the following

How these proposals may change your current journey

- Customers wishing to travel to Marble Arch would need to change between route 189 and 139 to complete their journey
- Re-routing the 189 from Belsize Road to Camden Town, rather than its current terminus at Marble Arch would better match demand along the Abbey Road and keeps bus links currently provided by route 31 between Belsize Road and Camden Town
- Re-routeing the 189 to Camden Town would create new direct journey links between Brent Cross/Edgware Road and Camden Town. Customers travelling between these locations would experience quicker journey times and would no longer need to change between bus routes to complete their journey

Interchange options under this proposal:

- For northbound journeys same-stop interchange from route 139 to route 189 would be available at Priory Road/Stop H. To assist customers waiting to board, there are seats and shelter at Stop H, however there is currently not a Countdown sign displaying expected bus arrival times
- For southbound journeys same-stop interchange from route 189 to route 139 would be available at Priory Road/Stop G and Belsize Road/Stop P. To assist customers waiting to board, both stops have a shelter with seating and stop P has a Countdown sign displaying expected bus arrival times
