





The sources of the Westbourne and their relation to the geology
















Finish of Part 2 West Hampstead Stations in 1746 (Rocque map)



Start: West Hampstead Stations






Finish of Part 2 **Bayswater Road Drinking Fountain**

Part 3 The Serpentine to the Thames




Start: Head of the Longwater in Hyde Park

Note how the river has eroded the much younger Thames Terrace gravels

From the outfall of the Serpentine to the Thames, the route is underlain by pale yellow Alluvium

Finish: Chelsea Embankment










Hyde Park
